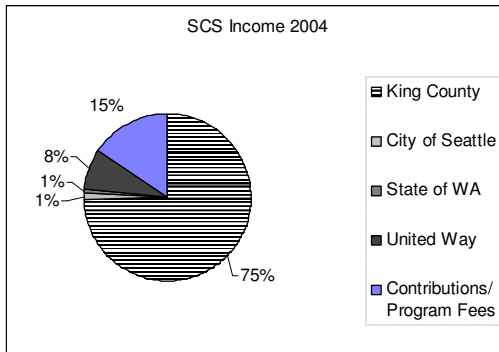
SCS served over 1,100 clients in 2004:

- 731 clients received comprehensive mental health services.
 - 193 clients participated in individual and group services through Project NEON.
 - 183 clients engaged in chemical dependency treatment services.

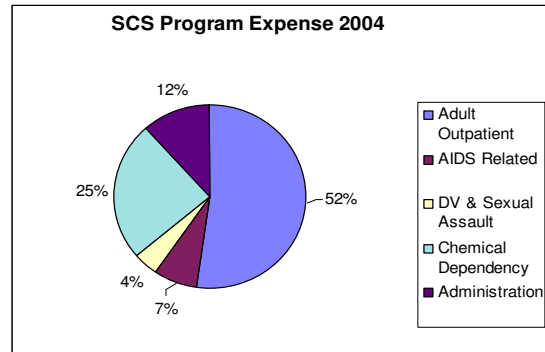
2004 Highlights:

- ◆ **SCS relocated to 9,000 square feet of space**, split between two floors, in a renovated modern building. The building allowed for increased space for therapy rooms, group meeting rooms, and staff offices.
 - ◆ **Staff worked for increased integration of all programs**--mental health, chemical dependency, and Project NEON. Improved communication among the programs led to better service and seamless access for clients.
 - ◆ **The chemical dependency program served 19% more clients** and continued to build momentum in its second year at SCS.
 - ◆ **SCS was the recipient of two community awards in 2004:** The King County Mental Health/Chemical Dependency Exemplary Service Award for Systems Integration; and from the Seattle LGBT Community Center's Fruit Bowl Awards, SCS garnered the Grape award for outstanding Non-profit Organization.
 - ◆ **Staff grew by 13% in 2004**, with the addition of a mental health therapist with a focus on co-occurring disorders, a chemical dependency counselor to work with HIV+ clients, and a health educator to work with project NEON.

Annual Report: 2004 At a Glance



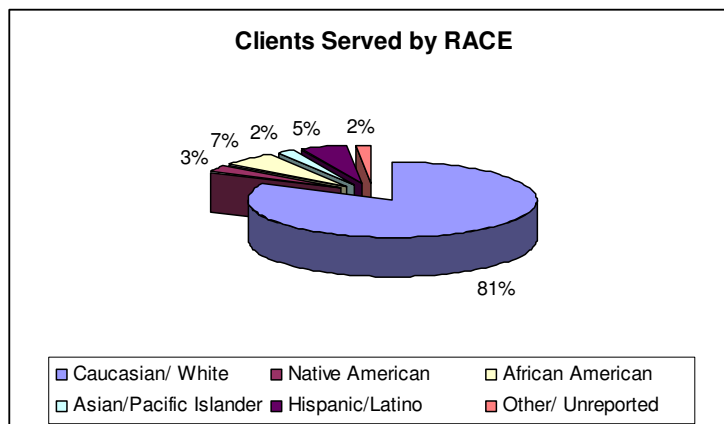
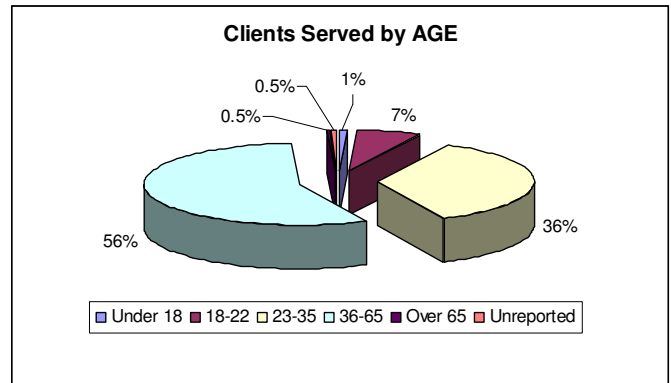
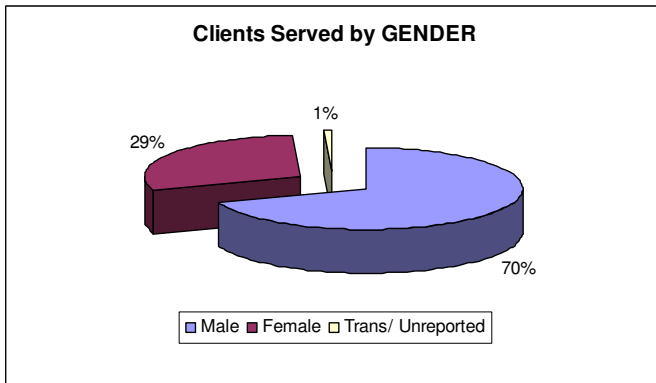
